



WHAT IS OPERATION LITTLE ANGEL?

Operation Little Angel (OLA) is a heartfelt initiative of the Marine Corps League Auxiliary (MCLA), launched in 2000 by a National President and two law enforcement officers—all members of the MCLA. What began as a simple idea of placing stuffed toys in police vehicles for frightened children has grown into a national program that provides toys, clothing, food, and essential items to support children in need across the country.

Sadly, many children—through no fault of their own—face difficult circumstances. OLA helps ease their burden by supplying agencies like child protective services, shelters, and police departments with items to brighten young lives and support struggling families. By helping a child, we indirectly support the caregiver, giving families a better chance to recover and thrive.

You can make a difference by reaching out to local child-focused organizations, identifying their needs, and starting a collection or donation drive. Common needs include:

- Baby essentials
- · Socks and underwear
- Warm coats and blankets

HOW TO GET INVOLVED & FUNDRAISE

Want to support Operation Little Angel in your community? Start by contacting local agencies such as:

- Child Protective Services
- Children's Homes
- Family or Abuse Shelters
- Police Departments

They'll provide a list of needed items or wish lists.

Simple fundraising ideas include:

- Ice Cream Social
- Paint Night
- Themed Food Nights (e.g., Spaghetti Dinner)
- Item drop-off socials among unit members

You can also contribute during MCLA's two annual events:

- Midwinter Conference (Feb/March)
- National Convention (August)

Local agencies are chosen by the OLA Committee to receive gifts, with many purchases made in the host community to boost the local economy.

Iwo Jima, now officially called Iwo To, is a small volcanic island in the Pacific Ocean, famous for the fierce Battle of Iwo Jima during World War II. It was strategically important for the US as a fighter potential base for planes bombers targeting supporting B-29 Japan. The battle, fought between US Marines and the Imperial Japanese Army, lasted from February 19 to March 26, 1945, and resulted in heavy casualties for both sides. The iconic image of the flag raising on Mount Suribachi is a lasting symbol of the battle.

Legacy:

The battle is remembered for the courage and sacrifice of the Marines and the fierce determination of the Japanese defenders.

The iconic image of the flag raising is a powerful symbol of the battle and of the Pacific Theater of World War II.

The battle influenced the decision to use atomic bombs on Japan, as it highlighted the potential cost of invading the mainland, <u>according to the National Museum of the Pacific War</u>.

In 2007, the island was officially renamed Iwo To, which is the older, more accurate name for the island.

Location:

Iwo Jima is one of the Japanese Volcano Islands, located south of the Bonin Islands.

Strategic Importance:

The island had two airfields that could be used as a base for US fighter planes supporting bombing missions on mainland Japan.

The Battle:

The battle began with a US invasion on February 19, 1945.

Japanese forces, under the command of <u>General Tadamichi</u> <u>Kuribayashi</u>, had heavily fortified the island with extensive tunnel systems and defensive positions.

The fighting was brutal and characterized by close-quarters combat and fierce resistance from the Japanese.

The iconic flag raising on Mount Suribachi occurred on February 23, 1945.

The island was officially declared secured by the US on March 26, 1945.

Casualties:

The battle resulted in significant casualties for both sides. Over 6,800 US Marines were killed, and over 19,000 were wounded.

It is estimated that all but 200 of the 21,000 Japanese defenders were killed, <u>according to History.com</u>.




